

Energy Bill Details

President Bush and Congress just passed an Energy Bill on July 29, 2005 that will give a tax incentive credit of up to \$300 to all homeowners nationwide who purchase a highly efficient water heater in 2006 and 2007. This bill was passed in an effort to address the nation's ongoing energy crisis.

Tax Credit Information

Beginning in tax year 2006, consumers will be able to itemize purchases on their federal income tax form, which will lower the total amount of tax they owe the government.
